
Leading Culture Change in Safeguarding PGCert

How will you be taught?

Rather than *attending lectures*, this course is designed to ensure we are always *attending to* learning activity and specific tasks. This diagram captures an example of activities associated with the course's three interconnected learning environments.



Online learning activities (OLAs) are posted in pairs to a virtual learning environment (VLE1). You manage your own time and energy to engage with each OLA in the initial two weeks so that you are fully prepared to make a positive contribution to the face-to-face (F2F) twilight teaching session (TT) that takes place in the third week.

In the fourth week, you reflect on what they have learned, personally and professionally, by integrating what they have learned from OLAs, F2F debates and any independent research undertaken. Your reflective and reflexive writing is recorded in your online portfolio (VLE2).

You will receive personal academic tutorial (PAT) support to ensure you meet course expectations of critical reflection and reflexivity so that you are prepared for assessment.
